Publicly and systematically, condemn anti-Jewish rhetoric, including negative stereotypes and conspiracy theories, at the European, national, and local level, as well as in political parties and political groups.

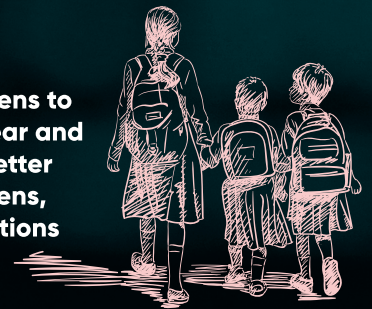

Support the adoption and use of the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance (IHRA) working definition of antisemitism and all its illustrative examples across the EU as a tool to better understand and address antisemitism and its contemporary manifestations.

Affirm the right of Jewish citizens to security and a life free from fear and support policy initiatives to better protect European Jewish citizens, schools and communal institutions and buildings.

Defend the right for European Jewish citizens to practice their religion, including the right to worship and to practice Jewish traditions and promote a culture of respect for the diversity of Jewish life and heritage in Europe.

Condemn hate speech and incitement to violence against Jews, whether online or offline, and all kinds of hate crime and advocate for better monitoring and reporting of such incidents.

Support efforts to preserve the memory of the Holocaust in the European Parliament and across the EU, oppose Holocaust denial, trivialisation and distortion and ensure that the topic of the Holocaust remains on national school curricula across the EU.

Affirm the importance of education against antisemitism and all forms of intolerance and support initiatives that educate against hatred in the classroom and beyond.

Promote dialogue and reconciliation between communities and faiths, favouring building bridges over boycotts.
